
Next term, we will be returning with our new topic 'Stars and Stripes', where we will learn all about the USA. But before then, I hope you all have a lovely Christmas!



Sporting Achievements

PE

This term in PE KS1 children have been developing their object manipulation skills. These skills include learning ways to throw, catch and roll using a range of objects such as bean bags, balloons and different sizes and shapes of balls. KS2 children have been focusing on their invasion game skills through basketball and handball. These two sports encourage a high level of passing and moving, a need to think about rules and tactics whilst playing and forces ways to use new skills that were taught in the lesson

Eight year 6 children were chosen to take part in this year's basketball tournament. They made it through to the finals after finishing second in their qualifying round. After some fantastic displays of basketball through two different days, the team finished 4th out of the 16 schools that entered the Rutland competition.

The event was a way to introduce girls to the game of basketball, where they learnt the basic skills of basketball in a circuit layout. On Tuesday the 30th of November, boys from year 3 and 4 took part in their first ever team competition for Leighfield. Despite the initial nerves the boys played fantastically, winning four games, drawing one and losing one. The girls played with a real grit and showed their endurance throughout the night as all seven of them had to play every minute of every game.
