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#### <u>EYFS</u>

Wow! We can't believe we've reached the end of our first half term in school! The children in EYFS have adjusted to school life exceptionally well and feel comfortable and secure in their new environment. So much learning has already taken place. We've learnt our first thirteen sounds and six tricky words so we're beginning to read real words in real books! We've studied numbers to 3 and explored counting, number bonds and used the vocabulary 'more' and 'less'. The children have also enjoyed their PE sessions with Mr Crowden and Forest School sessions with Jo and Mrs Ind.



#### <u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 have had a fantastic first term and they have all settled into their new routine really well. This term we have been learning all about the past so we have learnt a lot of history- looking at old toys and how they are very different to what we have now! We have also done lots of practical maths this term while looking at place value! Next term we will be moving onto <u>'Zoom to the M</u>oon' and starting to learn the nativity!









#### <u>Year 2</u>

Year 2 have settled into the new year really well. We have learnt lots and had lots of fun at the same time. We have done lots of practical maths, including ordering and comparing numbers. In our Geography unit, we have been learning all about Uppingham and were fascinated by the OS Map. In Science we have been learning about uses of everyday materials and how different materials are more suitable to a particular purpose.

#### **Science at Leighfield**

We have had an exciting term of science already!

We were treated to an assembly by 'Super Scientists', who wowed us with whizzes, fizzes and standing on eggs! This was ahead of our after-school science club, which starts in November. The club was full within 24 hours, but don't worry if you missed out this time as we plan to run another one in the Spring term.

We have also been fortunate enough to form a link with Uppingham School, which has enabled us to visit their science labs for some fantastic practical science!

Year 6 had a super lesson on chemical reactions.

Also, for the rest of this term, Year 3 and 4 will be visiting the Uppingham school science labs on alternate weeks to explore practical science linked to their learning in school. We hope to offer the same regular opportunity to Year 5 and 6 after Christmas.



#### <u>Year 3</u>

The children have had a fabulous start to Year 3. We have dived into our Stone Age to Iron Age topic, linking to our Art, Writing, Reading and History, plus enjoyed our day out at Flag Fen. I have been incredibly impressed with how well the children have settled into a new Key Stage and shown how hardworking and resilient they are. Some of the highlights of this half term are making our own Stone Age pottery and necklaces, as well as learning all about how people lived in Prehistoric times. Next half term we will be learning about Volcano's! I hope you all have a safe and happy half term  $\bigcirc$  .



#### <u>Year 4</u>

Year Four have made a fantastic start to the year, making the very most of their 'Perfect Potions' topic. They have spent the last few weeks learning all about the spooky story of Macbeth and writing excellent crime reports to solve the mystery of who killed Macbeth. Every child has thrown themselves into the play with imaginative and infectious enthusiasm! In the last week of term, we celebrated Harry Potter Day by making lots of different potions, casting patronus charms, drinking butterbeer and playing Quidditch. It was a magical end to the topic, and I am very excited to introduce our next topic 'Swords and Sandals' to the class after half term.



#### <u>Year 5</u>

Year 5 have enjoyed their first topic, finding out about the Ancient Egyptians. We have created our own maps of Egypt, found out about their everyday lives and the stages of mummification. We had lots of fun mummifying our own tomatoes!

In English, we have written our own diaries and composed our own version of the poem 'The Dreadful Menace'.

In Science, we have been learning about the properties of materials. We enjoyed investigating which materials were the most absorbent and which materials dissolved in liquid.

We are also loving our weekly swimming sessions at Uppingham Pool!
