Year 3

- Understands that their strengths and interests might link to jobs in the future
- Knows about and challenges common myths and stereotypes linked to jobs
- Understands the need for rules in wider society and what might happen if rules are broken
- Knows about basic examples of human rights and how they protect people
- Knows strategies to recognise whether something they read online is true and accurate
- Knows how to make safe choices online and how to report something online that worries or concerns them
- Understands that with every right there is a responsibility

Year 4

- Understands the benefits of living in a community and recognise the different community they belong to
- Knows about the individuals and groups that help in the community and shows compassion towards other in need
- Understands that everything shared online has a digital footprint
- Knows about online advert and can compare content shared for factual and advertising purposes
- Has a basic understanding of finance, including how to keep track of money and why this is important
- Understands that people make different pending decisions based on their budget, value and needs

Year 5

- Understands that there is a variety of access routes into work e.g. college, apprenticeships, university, training
- Understands the importance of protecting the environment
- Understands the way money is spent and how it affects the environment.
- Knows examples of, and challenge, some workplace stereotypes
- Understands how to show compassion for the environment, animals and other living things and recognises their own responsibilities
- Knows how information online is targeted
- Can identify their own job interests and aspirations and understands the role ambition can play in achieving these
- Knows about different media types, their role and impact

Year 6

- Understands the difference between prejudice and discrimination
- Knows some safe strategies to challenge discrimination and stereotypes
- Understands that having or not having money can impact on a person's emotions, health and wellbeing
- Understands about sharing things online, including the rules and laws relating to doing so
- Knows about some of the common risks associated with money including debt, fraud, gambling and theft
- Understands the role money plays in people's lives
- Understands why people choose to communicate through social media and recognises the risks and challenges of doing so
