This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, extra-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

The school uses several sources for curriculum teaching. This includes the Charanga's Creative Scheme, Rutland Music teaching, Young Voices and production preparation.

Pupils in year 1-6 participate in weekly, 15-minute singing assemblies and receive 39 hours of taught music lessons across the academic year. These are delivered in line with our [accessibility plan](#), to ensure that our pupils with SEND are well supported to access the full music curriculum.

- Our school music curriculum is informed by the [model music curriculum](#), non-statutory guidance for teaching music.
- Pupils have the opportunity to learn to sing through singing assemblies, taught singing lessons, Young Voices and production opportunities.
- Pupils in all year groups receive whole-class ensemble teaching with the opportunity to play the ukuleles, recorder or tuned/ untuned percussion.

- We have a strong partnership with Rutland Music NMPAT.
- Children have the opportunity to access peripatetic music teachers from Year 2 – Year 6.

Part B: Extra-curricular music

For example:

The school offers a range of one-to-one, small-group and large-group music tuition beyond the core music curriculum during the school day. This is provided by a range of local music tutors and paid for by parents, with a 25% subsidy for pupils in receipt of the pupil premium. This tuition includes opportunities to complete grade examinations with the following instruments:

- Brass
- Violin
- Flute
- Piano
- Guitar/ukulele

Children also have the opportunity to sign up for 'iRock', which offers teaching in singing, keys, guitar and drums in an ensemble setting with termly performances.

We have a dedicated music room for instrument lessons.

Pupils in years 2-6 also have the opportunity to join the school choir which is free to join. The choir has the opportunity to perform at the following events:

- Leighfield Open Day
- Harvest Assembly
- Late Night Shopping Christmas Carols
- Christmas Carol Concert
- Young Voices
- Music Evening
- Summer/ Winter Fetes
- Care Home Visit

Part C: Musical experiences

Weekly singing assemblies include working towards seasonal performances to parents, including during our annual carol concert. This includes learning to sing in rounds using pre-recorded music as well as with a live pianist.

The school has a theatre trip each year with Key Stage 1 visiting our local theatre and KS2 visit Corby Cube to watch a pantomime in the Autumn term for all pupils to enjoy.

Pupils have the following opportunities to perform in concerts throughout their time at our school:

- EYFS – Year 2: Musical Nativity (December)
- Year 3 – Year 5: Musical Easter Production (April)
- Year 4 - Percussion concert (guided by NMPAT teacher) (December)
- Year 6 Leavers' Performance (July)
- Year 5 & Year 6 – Ukulele performance at Music Evening

Pupils taking instrument tuition have opportunities to perform in our Music Evening to parents, staff and siblings.

Pupil in the school choir have the opportunity to take part in the Young Voices concert at the Resorts Arena in Birmingham each year. Parents are asked for contributions to cover the cost of this event.

In the future

To further enhance our music provision, the school development plan includes the following aims for 26 - 27:

- Develop the assessment of music across our Curriculum.
- Redevelop methods of evidencing of classroom music teaching.
- Monitor new Charanga units assigned for the 2025-26 academic year and reassess effectiveness/ quality.
